Reasons listed might include repetition of words, e.g. Wagga Wagga, nj and ng spellings, e.g. Ngarrindjeri; heavy use of r, n, j, g, m, k and w sounds; hard vowel sounds, e.g. the hard E in Menindee, the hard O in Coober Pedy; double-letter spellings (especially R and L), e.g. Narrabri, Woolloongabba; and a tendency to end with a vowel sound, e.g. Coomera, Echuca, Gundagai.
